**In 2016**, a number of AMA clubs in District I experienced a greater interest and acceptance of multirotor racing by their members. Many RC hobby retailers have stated that multirotor aircraft and their accessories represent one of the largest areas of sales today.

As newcomers become proficient at multirotor flying, they are joining the AMA in order to enter racing competitions being offered at local AMA clubs. Those traditional AMA model aircraft fliers who started dabbling in FPV flying throughout the last few years, are now being joined by these younger and passionate multirotor racing enthusiasts. Clubs are creating racecourses at their flying sites.

Many clubs and members have contacted me requesting help in getting involved in multirotor racing. In November 2015, the AMA officially welcomed MultiGP as AMA's newest Special Interest Group (SIG) to represent the FPV racing community.

At that time MultiGP had 4,000 members and 175 chapters. In nine months, as of September 2016, the AMA multirotor SIG had 10,631 members and 774 chapters worldwide. District I has 347 members and 10

chapters in MultiGP.

Adam Proulx contacted me in February for assistance and support for a multirotor race course at the Wingbusters Model Airplane Club in Halifax, Massachusetts. The plan was approved by the club and an excellent racecourse was set up on the club's site at a location also used for Control Line (CL) flying.

Within a few short months, Adam became an AMA contest director,

created a MultiGP chapter, and ran the club's first race. By September, the chapter had 12 sanctioned racing events, including the event that I attended, which is pictured in this column. The chapter has 46 members and still growing.
